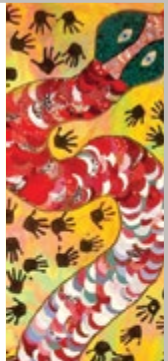

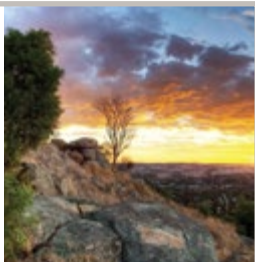

## SUSPENSION BRIDGE AVON PARK



York's original suspension footbridge first opened in 1888 after petitioning from residents for a footbridge to link pedestrian access east and west. A flood in 1891 saw the river flowing a metre above the foot-walk, but the bridge survived. The bridge was flooded again in 1893, widened and repaired in 1894 and further lengthened and moved to its current position in 1896. The bridge now stands as a testament to times past and continues to attract visitors to view its unique structure and photo opportunities.
